ADVOCACY

We serve as the leading industry advocate and are relentless in our approach to influence the ports' most urgent public policy issues.



Secured timely passage of the Thomas R. Carper Water Resources Development (WRDA) Act of 2024, which increased the federal cost share for construction and maintenance dredging to 55 feet.



Secured passage of sections of the Permitting Optimization for Responsible Transportation (PORT) Act, which will expedite permitting for port projects administered by the Maritime Administration (MARAD).



Secured the withdrawal of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)'s proposed North Atlantic Right Whale vessel speed restriction rule and supported legislation to delay and/or limit proposed vessel speed rules from NOAA until previously funded pilot programs are implemented.




Developed a national economic impact study which provided compelling statistics and facts to highlight the significance and extensive contributions of our nation's ports, including the 22 million American jobs seaports support.



Secured the introduction of the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) SPACE Act, legislation that would dedicate revenue to CBP and stop the government from shifting the cost of port customs and security onto ports.

ADVOCACY

Permitting

AAPA developed the PORT Act to reform federal permitting for port infrastructure projects by providing MARAD greater flexibility in using categorical exclusions.



At the close of 2024, portions of the PORT Act were included in the annual Defense Authorization bill and signed into law.

AAPA, alongside other organizations, also secured the other significant permitting reforms as part of the Fiscal Responsibility Act. The changes implement time limits on permitting studies and require federal agencies to more closely coordinate to reduce duplicative reviews.

Cargo Handling Equipment

Our organization is committed to ensuring America's ports can move the cargo our economy needs safely and effectively.

Thanks to AAPA-led advocacy, U.S. ports saved more than \$130 million in unexpected costs after the U.S. Trade Representative granted a limited exemption on a 25% tariff on ship-toshore cranes.

We continue to diligently oppose policy proposals to ban foreign manufactured equipment and investment. To that end, AAPA partnered with MARAD to generate a forthcoming study that assesses demand for domestically manufactured port equipment.

We hosted two Executive Roundtable discussions with all relevant stakeholders, including the National Security Council, to socialize cargo handling equipment alternatives.

The result: consensus around the need for a tax incentive, rather than blanket bans of equipment providers, to kickstart domestic manufacturing of cargo handling equipment.

During Hill Day at AAPA's 2025 Legislative Summit: Revitalizing America's Ports, our organization secured **96% of meetings requested** for a total of **47 meetings** with committee and personal office staff.


