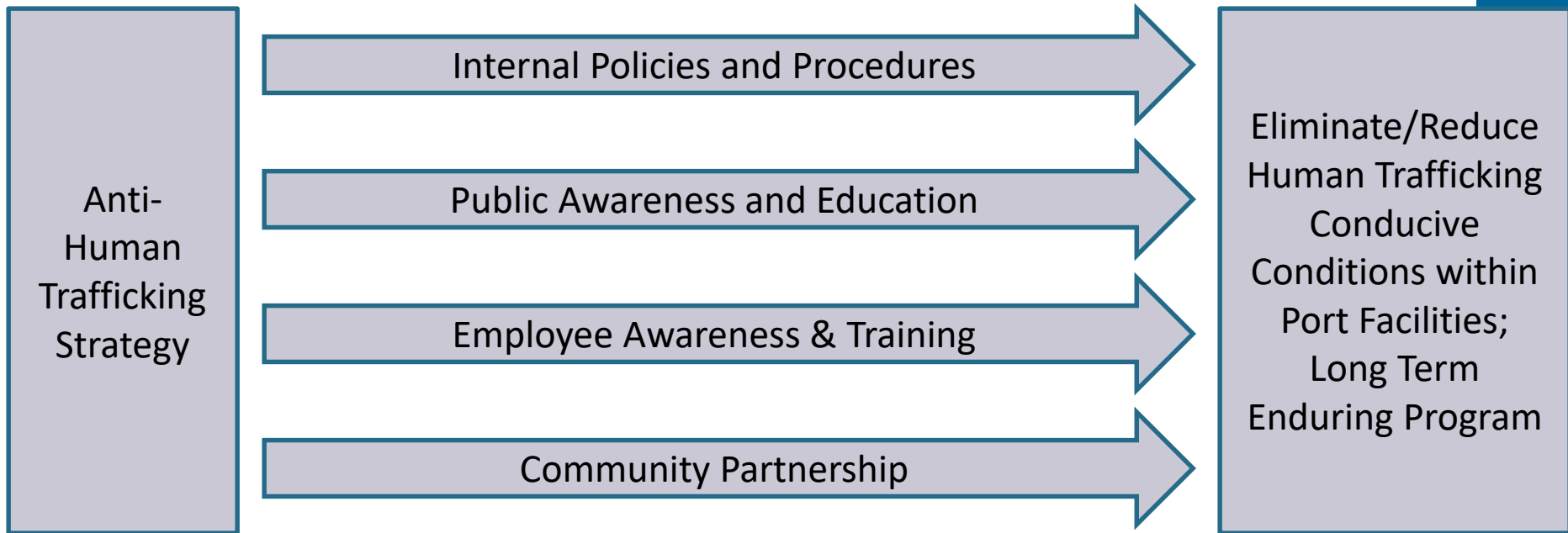

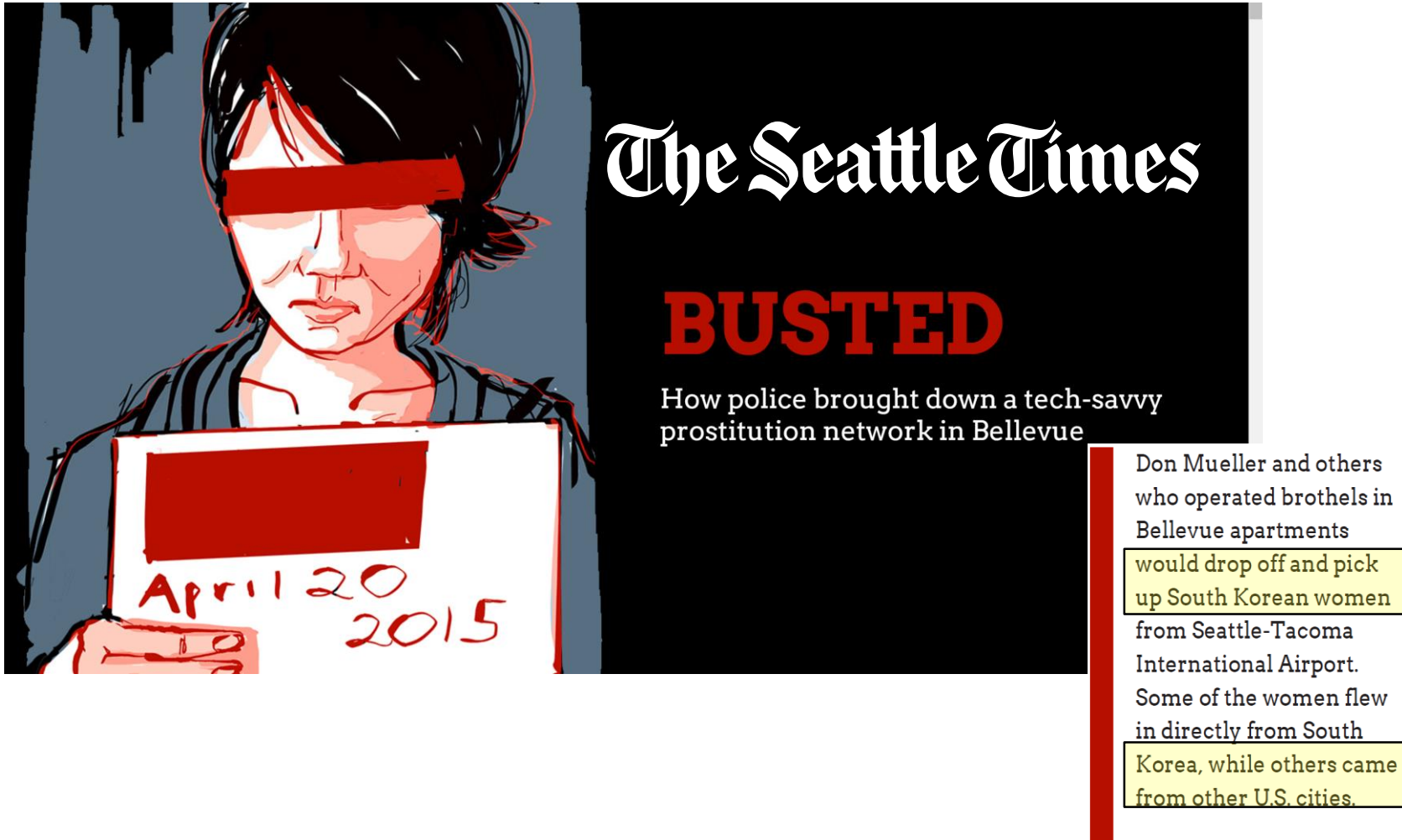

Port Human Trafficking Strategy

In January 2018, Commission passed a motion committing staff to finalizing and implementing a Port-wide strategy to combat human trafficking with four main focus areas:
