Every year millions of tons of cargo travel up and down the Mississippi River to and from ports in New Orleans and Baton Rouge. The Port of West Virginia will encompass up to 1,000 acres and 8,000 contiguous feet of Ohio River frontage capable of taking full advantage of the distribution network on the Mississippi River and its tributary rivers while reducing road congestion in the region. The Port will be in a position to attract new clients due to our Container on Barge operation and our intermodal rail and truck services. We will provide both bulk and breakbulk services.

Our enormous lay-down area will allow a significant number of containers to be redistributed to the whole Midwest region and redistributed to the whole Midwest region and beyond.
